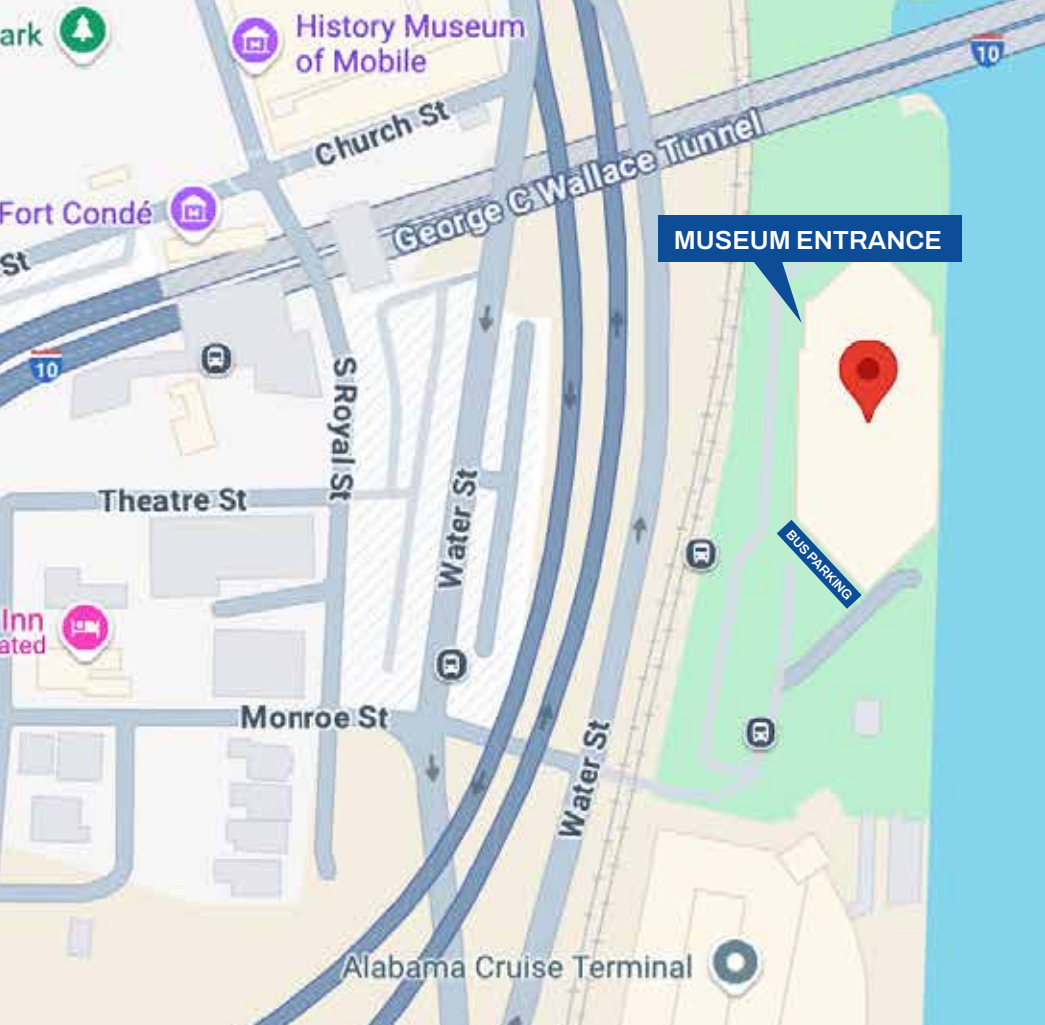

About the Museum

The National Maritime Museum of the Gulf has 8 “decks” featuring interactive exhibits on the history, commerce, and ecology of the Gulf Coast Region. With **more than 50 engaging interactive exhibits**, your students are sure to enjoy their visit.

Our exhibit content correlates to **Alabama Course of Study Content Standards in Science, Social Studies, Mathematics and English Language Arts.**

Group Drop Off and Parking

On arrival buses will drop off students and park in the bus parking zone indicated on the map. Groups will enter through the main museum entrance.

Admission Rates for School Groups

Pre-K \$7 per person

Students (Grades K-12) \$8 per person

Chaperones \$5 per person

Teachers All currently employed school staff (teachers, administrators, aides, and bus drivers) on school field trips are admitted for free.

Admission rates do not include tax. Private or parochial school groups that are tax-exempt should provide a tax-exempt letter in advance or on day of visit to receive tax-exempt rate.

Guided Tours

Guided tours can be scheduled for groups of students ranging from preschool (age 4) through 12th grade and are led by museum staff. Our dedicated staff of museum educators can tailor our guided tour so that it best suits your curriculum needs.

Tour appointments are available Tuesday through Friday starting at 9 am. Reservations must be made in advance. We require a minimum of 10 people per group. Our last field trip appointment of the day begins at 2pm. Large groups may have to visit the museum in shifts or on different days.

Setting up Your Field Trip

Complete the online field trip form on our website at the following link: <https://nmmog.org/field-trips/> or call **(251) 208-1048** between 8 am and 4pm Monday through Friday to set up your field trip. You will need the following information to fill out the field trip request form:

- Desired date of visit and two alternate dates.
- The maximum number of students and adults (chaperones & teachers) attending.
- Arrival and departure time
- If you are bringing lunches and eating onsite.
- School's phone number and address and the group leader's contact information

Please let us know if the group needs any special accommodations.

Review your confirmation

- Expect a confirmation email or follow up phone call. If you do not receive one within 72 hours, please call **(251) 208-1048**.
- If information in your confirmation email is not correct or needs to be changed, call or email us at your earliest convenience.

Things to Know

- Groups arriving late will be accommodated to the best of our ability.
- Reservations for field trips must be made in advance. Groups will receive a confirmation email at the time of booking, followed by an invoice if needed.
- Full payment is due upon arrival.
- Please confirm the final head count with us before the field trip date.
- We accept cash, credit cards, and checks made out to "City of Mobile."

Exhibition Spotlight



Science on a Sphere (S.O.S)

The National Maritime Museum of the Gulf is proud to be one of 170 locations around the world to have a Science On a Sphere® exhibition. Researchers at the **National Oceanic and Atmosphere Administration (NOAA)** developed this room-sized, global display system that projects visualizations of planetary data onto a six foot diameter sphere. This amazing educational tool teaches **STEM** concepts and helps illustrate Earth System science to people of all ages. It can also provide real-time data through NASA's satellites, making it a valuable resource for educational programs.

Animated images of atmospheric storms, climate change, and ocean temperature can be shown on the sphere, which is used to explain complex environmental processes in a way that is simultaneously intuitive and captivating. Planets and moons of the solar system and other celestial bodies, as well as historical, geological, ecological, and economic data can also be shown on the globe. Take the Helm

Step onto The Bridge and enjoy one of the most popular attractions at the Museum. "Take the Helm," is a professional ship simulator that allows guests to pilot a Coast Guard patrol boat into Mobile harbor or navigate a tugboat with a barge into a lock and dam on the Tombigbee River. Once you've mastered that, step outside on the bridge wings and enjoy an amazing view of Mobile's working harbor, and historic downtown Mobile.



E.O. Wilson

This exhibit highlights the ground breaking research of renowned biologist, Dr. E.O. Wilson. He was a native of Mobile, Alabama and his childhood experiences exploring local flora and fauna ignited his lifelong passion for ecology. Mobile's rich biodiversity and proximity to the Gulf Coast provided Wilson with invaluable insights into the interplay between species and ecosystems.

His study of fire ants began, at age 13, when he discovered the first known colony of fire ants in U.S. in Mobile. Wilson's subsequent work on fire ants has been pivotal to understanding the social structures and behavior of these ants, which pose a significant threat to agriculture and ecosystems.

While in this replica of Dr. Wilson's lab, guests can observe the behavior of ants and the surprising link this invasive species has to the Port of Mobile.

Jimmy Buffett Exhibition

Regular exhibit for 7th-12th

Coming September 2026, a new permanent exhibition dedicated to the life and work of Jimmy Buffett. This immersive exhibit will explore his remarkable journey from early days in Mobile, Alabama, to his rise as a global symbol of laid-back, coastal living. More than just a tribute, the exhibition will inspire visitors to embrace the joy, creativity and hard work that defined Jimmy's life.

Parakeets in Paradise-For K-6th grade

This exhibition is for children and will focus on the process of making music while highlighting some of Buffett's more kid friendly songs. This exciting interactive space will support Alabama Course of Study content standards for Arts Education and English Language Arts. Children will have the opportunity to play musical instruments, learn about composing music, and write their own song lyrics and stories.
